Good Theology

Theology is the study of God and God's ways. In practice, it usually comes out in terms of what we believe about God. There is Catholic theology, Baptist theology, Evangelical theology, and of course Lutheran theology. And then we have Islamic theology, and Jewish theology. Eastern religions, Buddhism and Hinduism etc. tend to be more philosophical traditions.

We usually argue of course over who is right. But today I would like to ask a different question. Rather than "right" theology can we say something about what "good" theology is? Is there a "good" way to study God and his ways? I think this is a better way to think about it. And there is, I think, a fairly simple way to tell whether we are dealing with "good' theology.

Good theology will communicate that it is not "right" theology. There is no "right" theology, there is only imperfect people studying God and God's ways. Being a good theologian is a lot like being a good farmer, or teacher, or a good musician. You're working at it. Good theology, then, will be humble.

And then "Good" theology will have another defining feature. It will be a way to begin a conversation, not end it. Too often we offer our beliefs to end the discussion. As if we "have" the truth. But good theology Is not a way to settle things, but open things up. The reason is simple, I think. The God we seek is found in the engagement. In the encounter, the relationships with one another that we make as we continue to grow and learn.

So, here is to "good" theology and continuing to work at it.

The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Allen Roelfs reported that giving has been a little light with harvest. Fairbury Glass has been paid, all window improvements have been paid. The Garage Sale went ok, but was a little light in sales. Allen thanked those who helped with the sale. All bills have been paid. The balance in the account is \$5,864.54. Brian moved to accept the report and Gary seconded. Motion passed.


Mission Work Day

Some of our congregational members have been in the hospital and/or suffered losses recently.


