### With God, There Are No Outsiders

This year, our readings will focus on the Gospel of Luke. The following is the introduction to the Gospel of Luke written by Eugene Peterson in his bible translation, "The Message."

"Most of us, most of the time, feel left out – misfits. We don't belong. Others seem to be so confident, so sure of themselves, "insiders" who know the ropes, old hand in a club from which we are excluded.

One of the ways we have of responding to this is to form our own club, or join one that will have us. Here is at least one place where we are "in" and the other "out." The clubs range from informal to formal in gatherings that are variously political, social, cultural, and economic. But the one thing they have in common is the principle of exclusion. Identity or worth is achieved by excluding all but the chosen. The terrible price we pay for keeping all those others out so we can savor the sweetness of being insiders is a reduction of reality, a shrinkage of life.

Nowhere is this price more terrible than when it is paid in the cause of religion. But religion has a long history of doing just that, of reducing the huge mysteries of God to the respectability of club rules, of shrinking the vast human community to a "membership." **But with God there are no outsiders.** 

Luke is a most vigorous champion of the outsider. An outsider himself, the only Gentile in an all-Jewish cast of New Testament writers, he shows how Jesus includes those who typically were treated as outsiders by the religious establishment of the day. He will not countenance religion as a club."

#### **NEW BUSINESS**



St. Paul Lutheran had a "Hanging of the Greens" worship service to begin Advent on Sunday, December 1.

The program was modified from one originally written by a Pastor and used with permission of Good Shepherd Lutheran and Zion State Line Lutheran Church that gave the background of all the greens that are used at Christmas and during Advent. The program and worship service was led by the Youth, and many traditional carols were sung that associated with the greens that were featured.

The readings were done by several Youth and Pastor Mark. The first reading by Brennan Schultis was about how Christmas is celebrated in America. The second reading, also by Brennan, was about the different colors and meanings of the paraments we use for worship. while Cale Clifford and Myleigh Weers presented the Advent banner and placed it at the front of the church while the congregation sang, "Soon And Very Soon." Pastor read about how the performing arts, specifically music, help express Christian doctrine and life. The hymns "Joy To the World" and "Silent Night" were then sung by the congregation.


