St. Paul Lutheran Church Council Minutes for September 21, 2022

Council members present were Dave Henrichs, Diane Wellsandt, Jeanette Bures, Peg Hemphill, Brian Weers, Gary Bergmeier and Pastor Mark. Dave opened the meeting, and Allen and Stacy Roelfs were present for insurance discussion for Pastor's Medicare. "God Sightings" were shared and Pastor Mark offered a prayer. The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed. Gary moved to accept the minutes and Diane seconded. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report

Alan Roelfs was present to give the report. He reported that the General Fund is in pretty good shape. Christian Education will receive \$500 from the Community Foundation Grant when it comes in. The Gold plan was selected as a contingency plan for Insurance in case we hire another pastor. Diane moved to accept the report and contingency plan and Gary seconded. Motion passed.

Memorial Treasurer's Report

The account received \$.77 interest and a \$1,500 memorial, making the balance \$13,529.29. Pastor was paid \$70 out of the Memorial Fund for the shotgun microphone that is being used for the worship broadcasts. The Eternal Candle stand is no longer available, so it will not be purchased. There was discussion about the Endowment/Growth Fund for future needs. A place is needed for principal to go to if the church were to ever permanently close. Balance for that fund is \$22,397. Dave moved to accept the report, and Peg seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report

4 worship services, 3 home communions, 1 other call, 2 Confirmation classes, 2 visits to the Care Center, 1 Cluster Meeting, 3 text studies, 1 meeting in Pickrell, 1 Youth meeting, 1 Confirmation Parents' meeting.

Vice Chairman's Report

Dave reported that the church received a check for the Picnic Food Stand from the Community Club.

Committee Reports

Worship and Music – Sunday, September 25th, we will not have a Pastor, so the Confirmation students will help with worship. Discussed Children's Sermons – whether to continue having them or not, because Beth is getting overwhelmed, so she may step down from doing them. We may cut down on the number of sermons or start taking turns with who provides the Children's Sermons again.

Christian Education – No report, CrossWalk started on September 14. See article in Newscaster.

Food Stand - Report included in Vice Chairman's report.

Property – No report.

Communication and Outreach – No report.

Memorial – No report.

Old Business

- Furnace heat exchanger still available, but we would have to wait until they get more orders. A unit is available on the East coast, would probably cost \$15,000 to \$18,000, installed. Gary moved and Brian seconded that we have Noakes keep looking for a heat exchanger for the old furnace and likely not purchase a new one.
- Gary moved and Peg seconded that we give our excess tables and chairs from the Sunday School rooms to Nile Lutheran Chapel, the Sudanese Refugee Church of the Nebraska ELCA in Omaha. Motion passed.
- The church will have a "Garage Sale" as part of the 136 Trail of Treasures on Friday and Saturday, September 30 and October 1, 8am to 5pm on Friday, 8am to 2pm on Saturday, with the proceeds to go toward the furnace repair or replacement. The sale will be posted on the Church website, Facebook page, bulletin announcements, etc. Anyone interested in volunteering is welcome!

New Business

- Pastor Mark wants to take off October 6-20 for a bike ride vacation. He stated he has things covered during his absence.
 - We need to pay a substitute Pastor while Pastor Mark is gone from September 22nd through 27th.

The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 20 at 7:30pm, committees meet at 630pm. Gary moved to adjourn the meeting and Jeanette seconded. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.




BACK 2 CROSSWALK
